Our Projects



Katakwi Rotary Malaria Project

In 2016, our team of doctors, researchers, and field staff implemented the first stage of our Katakwi Rotary Malaria Project, which aims to change the paradigm of malaria control and prevents ongoing malaria for more than 34,000 people. Newly trained health workers managed common diseases more effectively for a catchment area of more than 2 million people.

Beacon of Hope School

Beacon of Hope Secondary School in Soroti employed 28 teachers who provide quality STEM education to 677 students. This year, the school was also able to admit 31 new sponsored students and open a robotics lab and library. These new amenities are equipping students with the skills to address the current job market demands.





Beacon Medical Center

Our Beacon Medical Center serves the students and staff of Beacon of Hope, as well as the surrounding community. Treated several thousand patients (about half of whom were Beacon of Hope students) for malaria and other medical needs.
