

Beacon of Hope School

Goal:

Our vision in education is to provide young Ugandans an excellent STEAM education that makes them competitive, entrepreneurial and creative in a global, digital world. At the heart of our work is our commitment to bring Christ into every aspect of out teaching.




Beacon of Hope School Highlights:

This year buildings on annex land began renovation and repair in order to create more dormitory space at BOH. This will enable us to expand our enrollment numbers, giving more students access to secondary education in a country where there's a steep drop-off rate in attendance from primary to secondary school. Many students have never experienced the softness of a mattress or pillow before coming to Beacon of Hope, and we are excited to be providing this opportunity to more students than ever before.

Beacon Medical Clinic

The staff of BMC make it possible for the community of Soroti and our students to live full and healthy lives, aiding them on their journeys toward bright futures. In 2019, BMC treated 5,424 patients in Soroti, 3,188 of whom were students from Beacon of Hope. Between October and November, BMC recorded a nearly 300% decrease in malaria cases. During this peak of malaria season, 2 out of every 5 students had malaria. After treatment at BMC and preventative spraying from Beacon of Hope, this number dropped to less than 1 case in every 10 students.





PROGRAMS: Public Health

Katakwi Rotary Malaria Project

Goal:

Katakwi Rotary Malaria Project (KRMP) is a 6 year, 2 phase project that aims to make malaria control cheaper, faster, and more effective. We integrate community-led vector (mosquito) control and medical care to produce the largest impact, with the ultimate goal of eliminating malaria.

Project:

Uganda is a high burden country averaging 15 million cases of malaria per year. We have made incredible strides over the last 10 years, but progress like this is fragile and hard to maintain. We have seen it resurge in country after country when people start to let their guard down. We did have an upsurge this year when the mosquito nets wore out before the next net distribution took place. Our experience has shown us that Indoor Residual Spraying (IRS) dramatically drops the malaria burden.

Katakwi Rotary Malaria Project Goals (KRMP) - The goals of this project are first, in Phase One, to accelerate and use IRS as a big accelerator against malaria and in Phase Two, to sustain the gains after withdrawing IRS. When you bring the burden down very quickly as we have done with IRS, you significantly reduce the extent of the spread of the disease and reduce the costs of keeping incidence low.

What we know from the past is that when you remove IRS in Uganda, as we did in ten Northern districts, you see a resurgence immediately. So, the goal of Phase Two, which we just started, is to determine the best way to prevent that resurgence.


